1. What must it be?

Mini Documentary

### 2. Who is it for?

Open to all audiences

### 3. How long must it be?

1-5 minutes

### 4. What is your objective with the piece?

To document the story of Krystal and Chima's relationship, focusing on their personal accounts of their experience getting married at the start of the Covid-19 pandemic.

#### 5. When is it due?

May 7, 2022

### 6. What is the overall idea?

Tell a unique love story within the context of a trying time

### 7. What is the storyline summary?

A couple planned their wedding for March 2020. The unexpected challenge of a worldwide pandemic and quarantine arose, but they weathered the storm and had the perfect wedding experience.

### 8. Elevator pitch:

This is an encouraging mini documentary of two individuals who met in undergrad and fell in love in grad school. They got engaged on their graduate commencement day and started planning their wedding for March 21, 2020. 15 days prior to their wedding a nationwide quarantine and lockdown began. With their wedding quickly approaching, the couple was forced to make the biggest decision of their lives.

# QUESTIONS / NOTES

### SUBJECT:

- 1. Why did you choose this story?
- Krystal and Chima's wedding story is very inspiring and encouraging.
- Weddings and the wedding industry were hit hard amid the pandemic. This story gives a true account of how a couple pushed for a positive experience and outcome despite a challenging time.

### 2. Story ideas:

- Brief background on the nature of Krystal and Chima's relationship
- Brief look into their proposal
- Detailed accounts of wedding planning and the impact of the pandemic
- Brief look into life since the wedding day
- Quick nuggets of advice/words of encouragement

### NARRATION/HOST:

**3. Who will lead us through the piece?** The subjects will lead us through the piece

### 4. Narration ideas:

The subjects will recount their story directly.

### **INTERVIEWS:**

- 1. Who will you interview? A married couple: Krystal (wife) and Chima (husband)
- 2. Why is this person important to the piece? Both subjects get to tell their own story

### 3. What questions will you ask?

Questions about their relationship journey, including when they met, dating, their proposal, wedding planning, and their wedding day

4. What follow-up questions might be important?

Questions about their marriage since their wedding day. Their honeymoon, what they like about their spouse, what they do for fun, how they feel about their wedding day looking back, etc.

### B-Roll:

1. What b-roll visuals will be important to convey the story? Keep in mind you should show what the interviewees are talking about.

Photos and videos from the periods they refer to, including their proposal, wedding, and selfies/clips taken throughout their relationship

#### 2. Any still images or charts or graphics?

Some still images from their proposal, wedding, etc.

**3.** Is the nat sound of the environment important? If so, be sure to record it properly. The sound of their environment is not important, but their natural voices are, so I will use wireless lavalier microphones and a rode shotgun mic as a backup.

# INTERVIEW PREP INTERVIEWEE COACHING TIPS

- You're going to be talking a lot, so feel free to have some water by your side, let me know if you get hot, ask for breaks, etc.
- We're going to record a lot of footage, but it's mostly to give me a good range of footage to choose from. The final video will be 1-5 minutes long.
- Let's all set our phones to airplane/silent mode to ensure that filming isn't interrupted,
- Try to answer questions by repeating the question in your answer: What's your name and who are you married to? "My name is Krystal and I am married to Chima."
- If you stumble, no worries! Pause, take a second, and start the entire phrase over.
- A lot of the questions may seem redundant or sound like the same question phrased a different way, however, they'll likely provoke different answers and give me a variety of responses to choose from while editing.
- Don't look directly at the camera. Instead, try looking at either me or Aideh, as we ask you questions right next to the camera. This will make things feel more natural
- I'll need b-roll to fill in some of the footage, so we'll shoot some of that today. It would also be great to include photos of you guys throughout your relationship, videos you have together, etc. So if we could work together to get whatever you have sent over this next week, that would be great!
